18-0508.01 2018 Projects	<p>There are several projects moving forward either this summer or 2018-2019 school year which include the following:</p> <p>Parking lot expansion, which includes an expanded parking lot, shade structure, and ADA accessible ramp from Prospect Heights.</p> <p>Demolishing of two onsite portables</p> <p>2018-2019 projects will consist of the construction of new classrooms and modernization of the existing building.</p>	
18-0508.02 Immediate Site Priorities	<p>Life Lab Garden upgrades: The site would like to have the life lab entrance gate be on the inside of the campus gate which would need to include a ramp/steps into the garden. Trevor Miller would like it be a ramp.</p> <p>The PIP counselor will not be returning, they are currently located in the room behind the stage in the multi-use. The site would like for that room to be re-opened and the small stage taken out. Reopening the old stage, allowing for more space in the multi-purpose space.</p>

18-0508.03 Long Term Site Priorities	<p>Long term Site priorities are:</p> <p><b>Covered walkways</b>, it was mentioned that MADi is review further whether this will be a code issue that would ensue sprinkling the main building (adding major costs). The main concern for the site is heat, the sun causes major heating in the classrooms especially in the afternoons.</p> <p><b>Administration Entrance (Major Safety Concern)</b> , the current entrance does not allow adequate visibility of visitors. Would like the main entrance to open up on the administration and force visitors to pass through the office rather than directly into the hallway.</p> <p><b>Multi-Use</b>, the site currently has a small multi-use/cafeteria space not allowing for the site to have school performances and lunches inside (if it is a rainy day). The current capacity is 168 people which is under half the school population.</p>	
18-0508.04 Priorities VS Budget	<p>All projects for the site have been carefully considered based on the matrix of cost of the project, the safety value it will bring to the campus, and construction cost. The site committee agreed that priorities can change based off the cost of each project and the value it will bring to the campus. The Bond Advisory Committee is aware that the budget for the site cannot cover all the projects listed under the Master plan. Projects will be dicussed at each Bond Advisory Committee Meeting.</p>
