BACKGROUND:

Staff will facilitate a Board Study Session on strategic financial planning and managing future population growth.

Consultant Curt Pollock will provide an update to the Board on future fiscal planning given unexpected increases in enrollment and impending housing development. Curt brings extensive experience in school finance including serving as a Chief Business Officer at both the District and County level, positions at the California Department of Education, a decade with School Services of California, and served as a professor at Sonoma State University. In addition to these positions, Mr. Pollock has served as a mentor to Chief Business Officers across the state and worked as a private consultant for many school districts.

This work is in direct support of the following district goals and its corresponding metrics:

Goal #5: SCCS will maintain a balanced budget and efficient and effective management.

Declining Enrollment Review

- In 2021, both Fiscal Crisis Management & Assistance Team (FCMAT) and School Services of California (SSC) predicted
 16-17% declining enrollment for Santa Cruz County
- Fiscal Plan created based on 10-year decline
- Vision 2030 convened to discuss strategy



Declining Enrollment Update

- Enrollment significantly exceeded projection (342 Students)
- Year over year enrollment increased (169 students)
- **Housing stats** from the Regional Housing Needs Allocation (RHNA) 5 & 6 report **may indicate growth**
- Long term fiscal plan developed in the spring tied to declining enrollment
- Now, SCCS may be attempting to handle uneven distribution of enrollment increases



Impact of New Housing

- Up to 33 new housing developments within District
- Potential for **hundreds** (or thousands) **of new students**
- Optimistically, this could **offset declining enrollment**
- May create **capacity challenges** at some schools



Funding Generated from Enrollment

- Not all students generate additional funding
- **Elementary District: basic aid** (it will not receive any additional LCFF funding for additional students)
- **High School District (6-12):** district receives additional LCFF funding per pupil



Funding from Enrollment continued

- 77 students enrolled from 350 Ocean development:
 - o **32** elementary, **25** middle, **18** high school, **2** AFE
- The 18 elementary students will generate \$0
- The 25 middle school students may generate ≈ \$260,000
- The 18 high school students may generate ≈ \$218,000



Current School Capacities

- **The District may need to increase capacity** of schools to handle this growth
- **School capacity can be complex:** some "available" space is being used for special programs
- **Some of the schools may need to add classrooms** if space is available



Current School Capacities Continued

- **To consider:** could growth require the reopening of a closed school?
- **Another consideration:** could uneven growth require adjusting current school boundaries?



Adjusting School Boundaries

- Majority of new housing districted for Westlake, Mission Hill
 & Santa Cruz High (too much for our Westside schools to accommodate)
- **Potential solution:** adjustment of current school boundaries
 - Could reduce need for additional portables







Demographic Study

- Can assist District to project enrollment growth/decline
- However, recent enrollment fluctuation (combination of housing developments and uneven enrollment) complicates projections
- 2023-24 school year, the District saw growth despite projected decline in enrollment
- Growth may continue, but nearly impossible to predict accurately









Family Units in next 3-5 years (current boundaries)

















Possible Boundary Adjustments


Important note: ANY currentlyenrolled students will be able to continue at their school, regardless of boundary shifts.








Current Boundaries

Considerations & Recommendations for Future Planning

- Monitor enrollment regularly by grade and school
- Analyze whether to add additional classrooms (permanent or portable)
- Analyze whether to reopen a closed school
- Determine if additional staffing will be needed
- Revise financial projections as growth/decline occurs
